This was a four day meeting which provided to me an overview of the current clinical trials that the ANZICS group are conducting. As I am new to the area of "Clinical Trials" this meeting provided me with some background information about conducting trials in the ICU, the issues surrounds clinical trials (e.g. recruitment and obtaining consent) and some important "tips" on what and what not to do. Dr Anitra Carr and myself will be starting up and conducting a pilot clinical trial in the Intensive Care Unit at Christchurch hospital, therefore this meeting was timely and an invaluable meeting for myself.
